Let's Talk Orchids

Where has the year gone? It's hard to believe the 2013 orchid growing year is almost over. This autumn has been very mild and dry. These conditions have made it much easier to move plants into the greenhouse. There was no mad rush to cram them in before a frost or freeze - conditions I can remember in past years.

Now that most of my orchids and tender plants have been 'tucked' in for the winter months, my attention has turned to other chores: sharpening and oiling dull clippers, cleaning used pots and sterilizing pot clips and hangers. For cleaning pots I use 1 quart bleach to 9 or 10 quarts of water to fill a bucket and let the pots stay in this mixture for half an hour. Using gloves, I remove the pots and rinse them in a bucket of clean water. After drying, I stack them by size. For sterilizing pot clips and hangers I preheat my oven to 300 degrees and place them on an aluminum foil covered tray before putting them in the oven for about 1 hour. Cool for at least 1-2 hours before handling them. With these chores done, I know I won't have to do them in the spring when there never seems to be enough time.

As a reminder, this time of year means less water and fertilizer, so be careful. Water early in the day to avoid fungal problems. Close observation of your orchids can aid you in spotting insect problems early.

In bloom for November are Onc. Green Valley 'Sweet Lady' (gold and brown), Pot. Little Toshie 'Gold Country' (yellow with red lip), Blc. Rustic Spots 'H & R" (pink with darker pink spots on lip and petals), Paph. Pirate Spice x fairrieanum (light yellow with light brown on lip), Paph. Hsinying Almasum (white with green), Paph. (Kevin's Wine 'Macabre' x Pulsar 'Fang Pacific' HCC/AOS) (vinicolor), Paph. Jean Brice (yellow), C. Chocolate Drop (red), and Bc. Maikai x C. Interglossa (light pink with dark pink in lip).

This is my last "Let's Talk Orchids" column. I've enjoyed sharing my experiences and observations about this unique group of plants. Let's continue to talk about our orchids in the coming year.

News from Headquarters: The Dillon-Peterson Essay Contest deadline is fast approaching – November 30, 2013. The contest is open to all persons except employees of the American Orchid Society and their immediate families. You do not need to be an AOS member to submit an entry.

The winner receives a cash prize and a certificate suitable for framing. The contest was established in 1985 by the AOS Northeast Judging Center to honor the memory of two former editors of the *AOS Bulletin* (now *Orchids*). Gordon Dillon served as editor from 1943 through 1968 and again from 1970 through 1973. Richard Peterson's name first appeared on the masthead of the *AOS Bulletin* in April 1971 as associate editor. In 1973, he was named editor and, upon Dillon's retirement in 1977, he became the executive director, retaining his position of editor through 1984.

The theme for 2013 is: **Finding Space for One More Orchid**. Orchid growers are incurable collectors and always seem to find that one orchid that they simply must have. Tell us how you make space to for an ever expanding orchid collection. Membership in the American Orchid Society is not necessary to enter the contest. The deadline is November 30, 2013. The winning entry, if any, is published in the June issue of the following year. The 2012 winner was Sarah Waddoups and her Essay was "Playing Angraecoid Go Fish."
